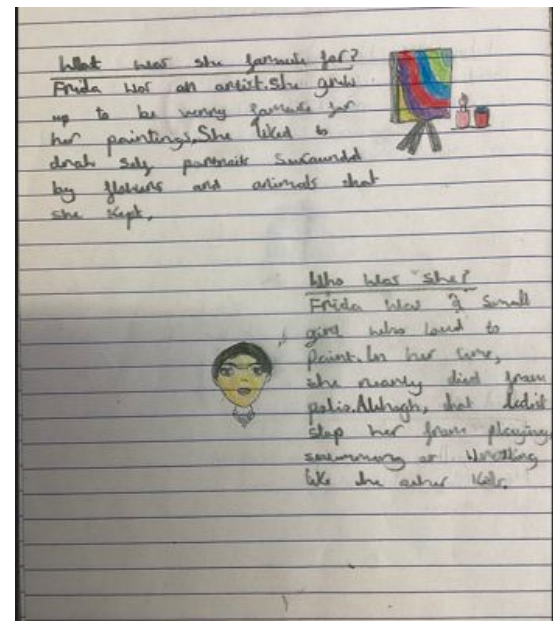
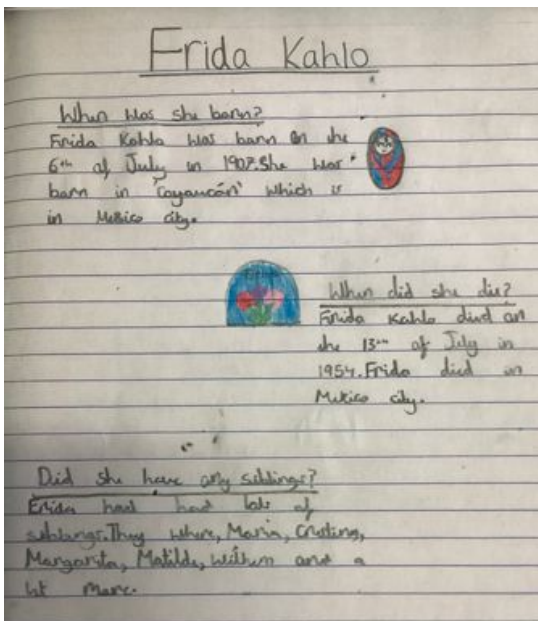

Attendance and Punctuality

The attendance rate for the children at Thomas's Academy has historically been high because you value your child's education and you know each day is important. However this academic year, our attendance figures have fallen below national average for the first time.

This is incredibly disappointing, as I'm sure you'll agree. Illness has certainly played a big factor in this, especially at the tail end of the Autumn term. Spring term attendance was similar to Autumn. Let's work together to make sure the ambition remains for excellent attendance during the Summer term.

May, had the best attendance that we have seen since November 2022. Well done and thank you for bringing your children into school regularly.

This must continue to improve!

Class attendance for the month of May 2023. Nursery is not statutory, therefore data is not included here.

Please note that we are obliged to contact the borough if a pupil has unauthorised absences that equate to more than 10% within a six-week period. This route will result in a Penalty Notice (PN) being issued or a referral to Family Services.

If there is a reason for your child to be absent, for example sickness or medical appointments, please email absent@academy.thomas-s.co.uk. For absence requests, a form can be collected from the school office for Miss Kelly to consider.

Punctuality is also incredibly important. The classrooms open at 8.45am at which point children can enter and engage with learning activities - these tend to be maths revision and challenges to support children's retention of maths learning. The register is taken at 8.55am after which point children are marked late. School doors close at this time and children will only be able to enter via the front office.

We are also noticing an increasing level of parents/carers collecting their children late. Children should be collected promptly at the end of their school day. Any parent collecting after being 10 minutes late, their child may be sent to Shine Bright Club and parents/carers may be charged a minimum fee of £10.



The Mayor of London funding Free School Meals 2023-24

The Mayor of London has announced funding for all pupils from Reception to Year 6 to be provided Free School Meals in 2023-24, this is an extension to the Universal Free School Meals currently offered to pupils from Reception to Year 2 and is currently being offered for the next academic year.

From September 2023, the school will be operating a compulsory school meal policy to ensure all children receive a free and healthy hot meal each school day which will be free to children from Reception to Year 6.

We still urge all families who think they may be eligible to benefits-related Free School Meal (FSM) to make an application through the Local Authority as the above is separate from the Pupil Premium funding we receive for pupils entitled to benefits-related FSM's.

For children entitled to benefits-related FSM's, you will also be provided with a one-off clothes grant (from the Local Authority) and currently will be provided with retail vouchers for over the holiday periods (from the School).

For every pupil entitled to benefits-related FSM, the school receives additional funding from the central government in the amount of £1,455 per student. This money funds valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

Message from Esther Harris - Fuel Poverty and Energy Efficiency Lead, H&F Council

Dear Residents,

My name is Esther and I work at Hammersmith & Fulham Council in our Climate Team, supporting residents with energy bills, energy efficiency and other energy related issues.

I am reaching out to let you know about a fantastic **opportunity for households in receipt of Free School Meals to get FREE home improvements through the Energy Company Obligation**, also known as ECO. ECO is a scheme that gives funding to energy suppliers to install energy-saving measures, such as loft insulation, wall insulation, heating upgrades and draught-proofing.

With energy prices remaining high, this is a great chance to get ready for Winter 2023. Installing energy-saving measures can have huge benefits to you and your household, including:

- **Reduced energy bills:** Loft insulation in a terraced house, for example, can save a household over £300 a year on their energy bills.
- **Reduced risk from cold-related illness:** There is a strong relationship between cold temperatures and a variety of different illnesses, and energy saving measures can help reduce this risk at home.
- **Improved comfort at home:** Installing energy-saving measures can reduce draughts and improve warmth at home, making you and your family more comfortable through winter.

Sickness

It is important to minimise the spread of infection in schools as much as possible. **If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.** We will be asking parents to collect children who are unwell. At school, we will be helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene and practicing regular handwashing. Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading which we will be encouraging.

We ask that if someone in your family is presenting with symptoms of COVID, you test for COVID. If a child tests positive, please let the office know and keep your child home for **5 days** please. We appreciate your cooperation with this. Unfortunately, we do not have COVID tests at school, they will need to be purchased from stores.

If your child has sickness or diarrhea, they should remain at home for 48 hours after the last episode. Thank you for your cooperation to help stop the spread of sickness in our community.

Inclusion Top Tips: Addressing Anxiety



Create a Worry Box – [Worry boxes](#) are containers which children can ‘post’ their anxious thoughts. They can help by giving children a physical way to get rid of their worries, and it encourages them to not keep their worries to themselves.



Activities to Reduce Anxiety– Talk to your child about what could help combat the anxiety they feel. For example, this may be doing exercise, drawing or painting, writing in a journal, watching a favourite film, talking to friends or cooking and baking. These kinds of activities can help them to feel calmer.



Develop your Understanding of Anxiety– Anxiety is complex, and sometimes difficult to understand. Check out [MyMindTV](#) to learn more about anxiety, and how you can support your child.

The Mental Health Support Team supports school staff, children and parents/carers to think about mental health and wellbeing.

But then, books started to come to life and were chasing me!!

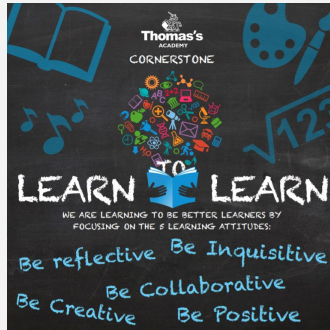
I was going to need some help from the Book of the Moon. It felt like origami fans. It sounded calm! It smelt like moon trees. It tasted like calm, kingy mint.

• Are we being good listeners?

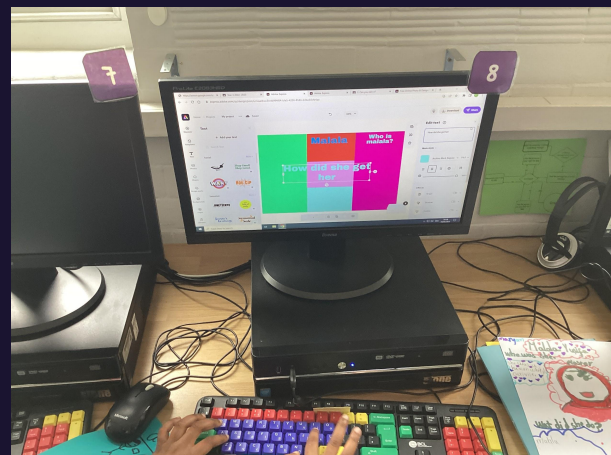
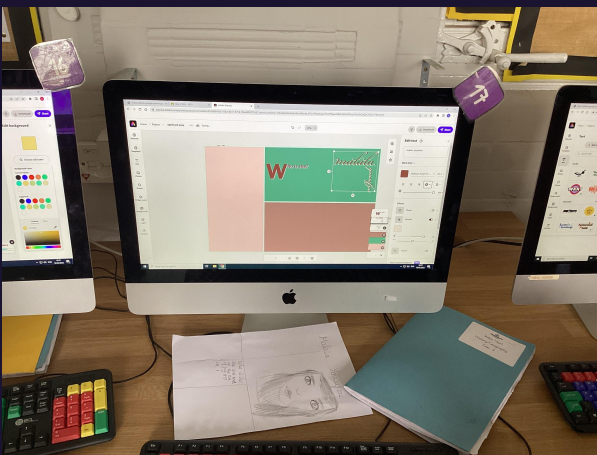
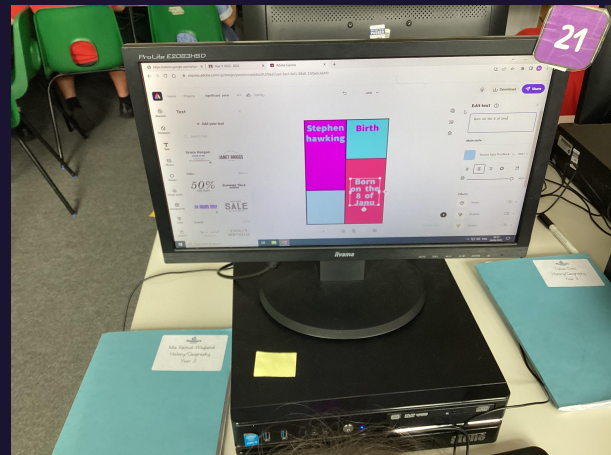
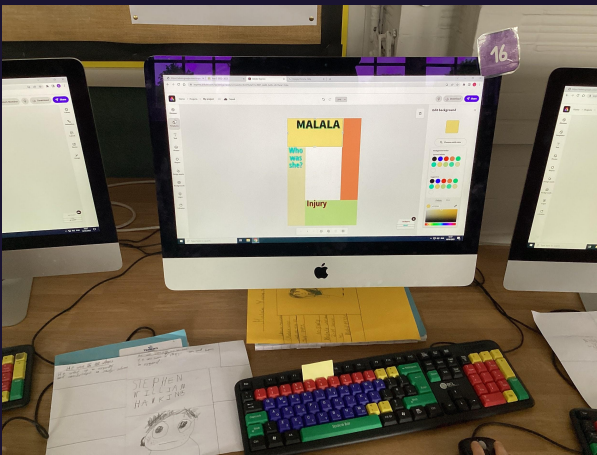
