In our '<u>How did the Maya civilisation compare to the</u> <u>Anglo-Saxons?'</u> History\_unit, we will be learning to:

- Name the features of the rainforest.
- Explain the challenges facing the Maya in the rainforest.
- Explain how the Maya settled in the rainforest.
- Name the features of Maya houses.
- Identify the similarities and differences between Maya and Anglo-Saxon houses.
- Name the features of Maya cities.

In our 'Would you like to live in the desert?' Geography unit, we will be learning to:

- Describe the characteristics of a hot desert biome.
- Locate the largest deserts in each continent.
- Name and describe the physical features found in a desert.
- Identify how humans use the desert.
- Describe some of the threats to deserts.

In <u>Art</u>, we will be exploring the topic illustration and imagination. We will study the work and processes of professional illustrators and experiment with our own styles, ideas and techniques. This topic will help us to develop our problem solving skills through activities such as responding to words through art and working from a brief.

### In <u>Music</u>

**Carmen:** Pupils learn the famous opera tune Toreador by Bizet and consider character and drama. Romantic period.

**Inventing the Piano:** Pupils meet who Beethoven broke harpsichords and moved onto pianos in the Romantic period. Look inside the piano

In <u>Dance</u> this term, Year 5 will be focusing on learning the core dance moves in both the ballet & jazz dance discipline, as well as their own creativity as a dancer. Not only will we be perfecting our dance routines, but there will be opportunities for them to choreograph their own dances within small groups, ensuring they are thinking about pathways, spacing and dynamics. Our main focus will be teamwork, memory skills and stamina.
